

# Creative Peer Facilitator Training and Development Opportunity

Do you enjoy working with children and young people, and using creativity to support your wellbeing? Then this may be the role for you!

Dulwich Picture Gallery is working collaboratively with the South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust (SLaM) Recovery College to offer a paid training and development programme for four creative peer facilitators who are aged 18-25 and who have lived experience of accessing secondary mental health or addiction services either through child and adolescent mental health services (CAMHs) or adult services.

Creative Peer Facilitators (CPFs) will take part in a paid training and development programme and working alongside our artist team they will support the delivery of creativity and wellbeing activity for students in local primary or secondary school settings. The aim of the creative sessions will be to help students and teachers explore how the arts and creativity can be used as a tool to support positive mental health and wellbeing.

All workshops will be designed using the co-production model developed by the SLaM Recovery College with all content being co-designed and co-delivered by the CPFs and Artist Facilitators.

# We are looking for...

As the programme has co-production at its heart and aims to value the importance of lived experience we are looking for people who:

- Currently use SLaM Services or have been discharged from CAMHs or adult services.
- Are aged between 18-25 years of age.
- Have a good understanding of the local needs and diversity of our priority boroughs of Southwark, Lambeth and Lewisham. This could be through growing up, living or working in the areas.

## What you can expect to do in the role...

- Attend paid training and development opportunities delivered by the SLaM Recovery College and Dulwich Picture Gallery in a wide range of areas including co-production, facilitation, creative planning, and an introduction to freelancing.
- Work in collaboration with an Artist Facilitator to co-design and co-deliver workshops for students from either a local partner primary or secondary school. Workshops will aim to support students to explore how the arts and creativity can be used as a tool to support positive mental health and wellbeing and will be themed around the Dulwich Picture Gallery collection.
- Co-prepare session plans, workshop resources and workshop rooms for allocated sessions and coordinate the collection of registration and evaluation working in partnership with an artist facilitator and onsite team.
- Help to provide a friendly, safe and welcoming environment for all visitors and participants.
- Contribute to the ongoing design of future creativity and wellbeing programmes for the Dulwich Picture Gallery schools and youth programme.

## What skills and interests are helpful...

- Interested in working in a gallery/creative environment and supporting creativity and wellbeing for everyone.
- Experience (voluntary or paid) that includes working with children and young people.
- Happy to work within the spirit of co-production and co-delivery across all aspects of the role.
- Confident communication skills
- Ability to treat all people with respect and dignity at all times.
- Flexibility to attend training and development days.
- Experience of using a range of self-management and / or recovery tools and techniques.
- Motivated and reliable, and able to follow policies, procedures and instructions including safeguarding, access and equal opportunity policies and procedures.

## What you get as a Creative Peer Facilitator...

- Access to a paid and supported development opportunity within a cultural institution.
- Access to careers workshops delivered by Creative Access.
- Valuable transferable skills and experiences in areas of facilitation, creative planning and wellbeing programming.
- Support to set up and establish yourself as a freelance practitioner and/ or signposting and support to access further development opportunities at the end of the programme.
